

Welcome to Your New Home and the Village of Newton

Helpful Information – June 2019

This leaflet has been produced by Newton and Biggin Parish Council to provide information about organisations and facilities the village has to offer you. There is also a list of local contacts you may find helpful when settling into your new home.

1. Activities

1.1 Public Houses

There are two public houses in the parish. The Stag and Pheasant on Main Street runs a Ladies skittles team who meet on Monday evenings, it also has a Men's football team. There is a pub quiz every Thursday evening, music nights are organised through the year, plus darts and a pool table.

The St. Thomas Cross is situated on the junction of Newton Rd and Newton Manor Lane. It has a children's play area with BBQ and live bands play in the purpose built shelter in the summer months. It also runs various pub games and sports teams.

1.2 The Village Hall

The Village Hall is situated in Silver Street and is used by the community for a variety of purposes including brownies/guides, yoga, pottery and Live and Local performances. 1.3 The Five Arches Wildlife Site

This public site is located at the northern end of the Great Central Way footpath and cycleway and is accessed from the Newton picnic site car park. The site is managed by Butterfly Conservation in partnership with the Parish Council in the interest of improving biodiversity.

1.4 Allotments

Newton Townsland Allotments are the second oldest in the country (founded 1757). They are located at the bottom of Little London Lane and are in popular demand. Should you have 'green fingers' and would like to be added to the

2.1 Public Transport

Arriva has a bus service which links Newton to Rugby. There are bus stops into town at the Leys and on Main Street opposite Silver Street. Return buses stop next to the Paddocks. Timetables are subject to change so check the timetable at the bus stops or on the Arriva Website.
