BIG NEWS -Village Hall Refurbishment Update

Phase two of the Village Hall refurbishment is now complete. The Parish Council in collaboration with the Village Memorial Hall Committee has organised and worked on the following:

- Phase 1 completion of a new weatherproof roof.
- **Phase 2** refurbishment of the kitchen, including a new cooker, dishwasher, fridge/freezer, servery, flooring, storage, work surfaces, new tiles and tiling and decorated by your Councillors. Installation of a french window. Refurbished toilets, including disabled and baby changing facilities. Internet provision is currently being explored. Pictures of the finished kitchen and toilets are to the left!
- **Phase 3** pointing to the front elevation and installation of an oak framed welcoming porch is dependent on a Rural Development Grant applied for from Rugby Borough Council.

Your Parish Council has been busy during the winter and spring supporting the following initiatives:

- The Parish Council worked with the Good Shepherd Church to commemorate Remembrance Sunday on 10 November 2019
- Christmas celebrations with a wellattended Carol Service and Christmas tree light switch on. Santa Clause even attended
- As previously reported, the Children's play area at Ellis Gardens has been safety tested and is now open for use. The Parish Council takes legal ownership of this open space in future and is working with Lioncourt, the developers to ensure the site is completed and all planting takes place as per the plans and that ensure that the playground is fit for purpose
- The Five Arches Wildlife Reserve has been formally opened and seeded with natural butterfly friendly seeds, new Elm trees and the first of a series of rustic benches.
